<b>Prerequisites:</b>	/		
<b>Course objectives:</b>	Developing an intermediate level of English among students through relatable and useful topics. Encouraging and supporting learners to use their English in a way that enhances their day-to-day experiences. Learning outcomes: developing across all four key skills; reading, writing, speaking, and listening, as well as vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation. Developing and using students' knowledge of English grammar and their ability to use it accurately in all four skill areas.		
<b>Teaching units:</b>	<p>Topics include: education and learning, student life, research, relationships, socialising, future trends, environmental issues, arts, job prospects, good and bad experiences, the news, travel and holiday, and many more.</p> <p>Grammar topics include: questions, verb tenses, modal verbs, infinitives vs. gerunds, nouns and articles, conditionals and wishes.</p> <p>Course will include one mock exam (quiz), and a grammar revision session. Course may include additional graded quizzes, homework. Students are expected to do homework and read in English throughout the semester.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.
